Explanation

The electricity tariffs remain almost unchanged as a result of a slight increase in average fuel expenses for the production of electricity which is offset by slight decrease in the correction factor regarding the month of November 2020. The increase of the water tariffs is primarily the result of an increased correction factor regarding November 2020 due to deviation of the actual production-mix in relation to the forecast.
