Explanation

The decrease in electricity tariffs is mainly the result of lower average prices of fuel used throughout the production cycle in the month of June 2021, along with lower correction factors pertaining to April 2021. The increase in water tariffs is mainly the result of higher correction factors pertaining to April 2021, which is partially offset by lower electricity prices used throughout the production cycle of water in the month of June 2021.
