Explanation

The slight increase in electricity tariffs results from a combination of lower average fuel expenses for the production of electricity, which was offset by a higher correction factor for the month of May 2021.

The increase in water tariffs results from a combination of higher costs for the production of water due to the production mix, which was partially offset by lower correction factor throughout May 2021.
