Explanation

The increase in electricity tariffs results from higher average fuel expenses for the production of electricity which is caused by increased fuel prices and the production mix, in combination with a higher correction factor for the month of June 2021. The decrease in water tariffs results from lower costs for the production of water due to the production mix, which was partially offset by a higher correction factor throughout June 2021.
