Explanation

The increase in electricity tariffs results from slightly lower average fuel expenses for the production of electricity which is caused by the forecasted production mix, which is offset by higher correction factor for the month of August 2021. The increase in water tariffs results from higher average electricity expenses for the production of water and also higher correction factor for the month of August 2021.
