Explanation

The increase of the electricity tariffs is the result of a rise in the average fuel expenses for the production of electricity which was caused by an increase of fuel prices, the forecasted production mix and a higher correction factor for the month of April 2022. The decrease in water prices results from higher electricity costs for the production of water which are offset by a lower correction factor for the month of April 2022.
