Explanation

The increase of the electricity tariffs is the result of an increase in the average fuel expenses for the production of electricity due to a significant increase in the fuel prices in combination with the expected production-mix (including a higher share of energy from wind turbines and a decreased operation of more cost-efficient production-units) and a lower correction factor for the month of January 2023. The increase of the water tariffs is the result of an increase of the electricity expenses for the production of water in combination with a higher correction factor for the month of January 2023.
